Integrity

Are you true to your own belief and are you honest with yourself? Do you feel that you have a strong moral compass?

Risk-taking

Are you audacious and do you take risks to explore new experiences? Do you challenge yourself to do things you find difficult? Are you willing to try new things or do you prefer to stick to the orthodox? Are you resourceful in unfamiliar circumstances?

Curiosity

Do you pursue knowledge and understanding for its own sake? Do you seek to know more and explore new things? Do you ask lots of questions to enable you to deepen your understanding? Are you confident in the value of your interests?

Ambition

Do you wish to do the best you can and make the most of every opportunity afforded to you? Do you believe that effort will improve your future prospects? Do you let others hold you back?

Independence

Do you feel that you take responsibility for yourself? Are you self motivated?

Humility

Do you acknowledge that individual success often relies on team effort? Do you see that success is important but that it is not everything? Do you recognise that others may not be as privileged as you?

13+ Music Scholarships 31st January to 2nd February 2022

Where being physically present at the College for the assessment is simply not possible, an online alternative mode of assessment may be discussed with the Director of Music.

Timetable

Candidates will be called for interview on one of the three designated assessment days. The Director of Music will issue the detailed programme to schools and parents approximately one week before the assessment.

Music Teachers Association (MTA)

Parents and Prep Schools are asked to note that the school follows the MTA Code of Practice, the key tenets of which are attached. The Code is designed to ensure fairness and transparency in the scholarship process and should be adhered to by all applicants.

Assessment

Candidates would normally have reached the equivalent of a good Grade 5 (ABRSM or Trinity) standard on at least one instrument or singing and show general musicianship commensurate with their technical ability. However, it should be noted that the Department are also looking for musical potential and commitment as much as existing achievement. The audition requirements are the presentation of two contrasting pieces on the candidate's first instrument / vocal study and at least one piece on any other instruments offered, including singing. There will also be ear tests and scales and arpeggios of the last grade examination taken on their first study as well as a discussion with members of the Music Department. In addition a piece of music equivalent to the technical standard achieved on their first study as stated on the application form will be sent to the school of the candidate a week in advance to be prepared and performed at the audition.

If a second or third instrument is offered (which is by no means essential), it need not necessarily be at Grade 5 standard but does need to be well prepared and be a positive contribution to the application. A good singing voice would be a strong additional recommendation for instrumentalists and it is important that full details of vocal experience are given in the Music Report on the completed Scholarship entry form.

Candidates will also be asked to perform as part of a small ensemble with existing College musicians. Details of preparation for this part of the assessment will be issued towards the end of the Autumn Term of Year 8.



Music Teachers' Association (MTA) Code of practice for Music Awards at 13+

Relevant details from the Code of Practice:

- For parents wishing to apply to more than one school, they should place them in order of preference. Once the application has been submitted they may not be altered. This order must be identical on the application form for each school and include all schools to which parents are applying, even if an individual school has not signed up to the code.
- For the system to run effectively any bursary applications should be made in advance of music award applications, so that parents have all the facts at their disposal when deciding on an order of preference.
- Applications forms must be signed by the Head and Director of Music of the present school. The present school (not the parent) will then send copies of the application forms (together with a confidential reference) to each school at which a music scholarship is being sought.
- No school will make offers or intimations of awards before the trials.

- Results of the audition are announced promptly following the trials by the school of first choice.
- When applications are made to more than one school, the 2nd choice school should wait to hear from the first choice school whether or not an offer is being made. If it is, the 2nd choice school must not make an offer. If the 1st choice school is not going to make an offer then the 2nd choice school is able to make an offer if they wish. An identical procedure follows for the school of 3rd choice.
- Awards accepted verbally must be confirmed in writing (or email) and must be taken up in the following academic year.
- No award may be confirmed until all the requirements of Common Entrance/other entrance requirements have been met.


